Adult Art Classes

Silversmithing Sessions May 17, 18 / June 7, 8 / Sept 22, 23

Annie McFarlane / Mount your favorite beach glass or beach stone into a beautiful pendant set in silver. The Illuminated Landscape

June 1-3

Kris Love / Do you love painting the landscape, but are challenged by capturing the changing sky? This class will focus on landscape painting with emphasis on the dynamic color and atmosphere of the skies of northern Michigan. Expand your knowledge of brush and tool use to achieve more versatile paint application. We will work on location and from photographs. All skill levels welcome using media of oil or acrylic paint. Supply list upon registration. 10 am - 4 pm. **\$225**

Painting with Oils

June 14 & 15

Tobin Sprout / Students will study the fundamentals of oil painting from mixing colors to how light, shadow, and reflected light affect the image. We will look at shapes and contrast and how these small pieces make up the whole of the painting. Bring paints, brushes, palette, cleaner for oils, paper towels and canvas. 10 am - 2 pm. **\$75**

Watercolor Sampler

June 21-23

Paul St. Denis / Experiment with three different approaches to watercolor. The first day will focus on painting the Michigan landscape including dunes, grasses, water & trees. Flower painting on the second day will emphasize floral construction, composition and color mixing. Finally, combine the element of collage with watercolor to create an impression of Fishtown or other motifs. 10 am-3 pm for all skill levels. **\$140 / \$50** per day.

June 11, 12, 13

Meet the artists and view a mixed media presentation of a lifetime collection of original artwork in oils and watercolor. Join us for the opening reception on Friday, June 11 from 5 to 8 pm. The exhibit continues Saturday 10 am to 5 pm and Sunday 12 to 4 pm.

All day intensive workshops

June 24 (full) & Aug 9

This workshop is designed to engage the student watercolorist in a wide variety of watercolor applications. Woven into these exercises will be sound principles of "picture making" including formats, value pattern schemes and organized color palette use. Class size limited, registration required. 10 am to 4 pm. **\$25**

Lecture and demonstration

July 12

Charles will give a presentation on the history and development of the watercolor medium. The paint and its behavioral properties will be clearly laid out. Paired with this discussion will be active demonstrations to illustrate the examples. 1 to 4 pm. **\$10 suggested donation**

Working in watercolor and oil media, Charles Murphy has been painting and exhibiting throughout the region for the past 33 years. His work features landscape and seascape, social commentary, humor, or even pure abstraction. Charles graduated from Minnesota State University with his BFA in Studio Art in 1974. He has illustrated three children's books, "Reach for the Moon" in 1994, "Smokey the Raccoon" in 1999 and "Where is Bobbi?" in 2009. Charles is a member of the ISEA and currently has work in the 142nd Annual International Traveling Exhibition of the American Watercolor Society. He teaches painting at the Grand Traverse Art Center and was named Art Educator of the Year in 2003 by the Traverse Area Arts Council. He has taught at many art centers around the country and excursions to France, Spain, Italy, Nova Scotia and the Caribbean have provided this talented artist with a variety of subjects.

Gouache: Color and Form

July 13

Melanie Parke / Introducing gouache to all skill levels. Like watercolor, gouache is water based, has a wide range of transparency and allows easy transport and clean up. Unlike watercolor however, it offers greater body for layering, opacity and brilliance. This intensive one day course will draw upon observation in and out of the studio. Stressing shape, form and color investigation- we will spend the afternoon doing exercises focused on loose, expressive and fresh discoveries. Come prepared to experiment with design and abstraction. Instruction is centered toward personal direction. A variety of approaches will be demonstrated, informal critiques and discussions of traditional to contemporary genres will be available.

Drawing as Experience

July 15

Melanie Parke / Strategies in rigorous visual practices to develop informed, ambitious and disciplined seeing is the focus of this one-day intensive workshop, open to all skill levels. Exploring how the language of line and shape convey the fundamental nature of form will serve as a catalyst in experiencing personal and aesthetic meaning. We will work from nature both inside and outside, in sketchbooks and on large paper. The emphasis will be on immediacy, personal memory, engaging trust between hand and eye response, and generating a rich vocabulary of mark making. Instruction is centered toward personal direction. A variety of approaches will be demonstrated, informal critiques and discussions of traditional to contemporary genres will be available. 10 am - 4 pm. Class limit 13. **\$125**

Adventure in Watercolor

August 2 & 3

Charles Passarelli / Arguably one of the easiest and least understood ways to make your watercolor paintings stand out is through the use of color. In this class you will be shown by demonstration how to see new colors and apply them to your paintings. You will learn which colors are compatible and how to successfully use them to enhance your painting. The class will be furnished a photograph of the subject for each day and will all work on the same subject. The subjects will be landscapes to explore the various colors in foliage as well as the rest of the scenery. You will be shown colors in your subject that you may not have seen before and learn to add compatible colors to give your painting a dramatic effect. The instructor will paint a portion of the painting and then stop and let the students do the same on their painting. The process will be repeated until the painting is complete to learn a whole new vista of colors to add to your painting knowledge. 10 am - 4 pm. **\$135**

Drawing the Head in Graphite

August 4 & 5

Tim Kennedy / Initially we will be doing self-portraits from mirrors. Later we will draw directly from the model. After a few pointers regarding general rules of proportion, we will address techniques related to drawing with graphite. Initially we will work with ideas concerning drawing and perception such as sight measuring, negative shape, plumb lines and contour. After this initial investigation, the class will look more closely at the anatomy of the head, explore conceptions of form and ideas about light. During the course of the class the instructor will do

demonstration drawings and diagrams and show PowerPoint presentations that will feature anatomical illustrations and work by contemporary and historical artists. Supply list upon registration. 10 am - 5:30 pm. **\$110**

Basket Weaving Classes with Helen Raphael

Herb Basket / May 20, 21 with wooden handle to gather herbs, flowers and garden vegetables in a convenient size of approximately 15"x14"x6" tall with natural reeds. The length of the basket fans out on the edges to about 22". 10 am - 3 pm. **\$105**

Tote Basket / June 9, 10 with cloth shaker straps is woven with natural reeds with a color overlay of your choice. The size is 12"x7"x15" tall with garnishments to add when the basket is complete. 10 am - 3 pm. **\$140**

Market Basket / August 19, 20 with natural reed and one color of your choice for a large basket with handle approximately 16"x12"x8" tall. 10 am - 3 pm. **\$110**

Backpack / September 9, 10 with natural reeds and cloth shaker straps. Base is 12"x8"x18" tall. This basket includes a color overlay and garnishments. 10 am - 3 pm. **\$160**



Fabric Classes with Desiree Vaughn

Artful Fabric Painting I / June 16 This class is geared to quilters and others who want to design their own fabric. Students will learn about the basic paints, tools and materials used to apply a non-toxic transparent paint to fabric. A fun and experimental class for beg/intermediate students. Supply list upon registration.

Artful Fabric Painting II / June 17 This class builds on the introduction to fabric painting. We will discover more ways to paint, including stamping, printing, sun printing and color mixing. Intermediate students.

Introduction to Fabric Dyeing I / August 10 Whether you are a quilter or seamstress or simply interested in the process, this class is designed to give you the basic skills and confidence to dye your own fabric. We will use Procion MX dyes and cotton fabric and cover safety issues, 2 methods of dyeing and some color mixing.

Fabric Dyeing II / August 11 This class builds on the introduction class for the intermediate student to discover more ways to dye, including stamping, printing, painting and more color mixing. While we still want to experiment, we will also learn how to "control" the color and pattern.

Introduction to Shibori / August 26 Shibori is an ancient Japanese process of using mechanical resists to create pattern on fabric. Historically thread or string is used to bind the fabric to create the pattern. There are hundreds of techniques; the cloth can be folded, pleated, wrapped on a pole, clamped, or stitched. We will experiment with some of those techniques to discover what pattern they will produce.

Introduction to Soy Wax Batik / August 27 Batik is a form of resist dyeing traditionally using bee's wax and paraffin. While paraffin can be boiled out of cotton, it must be dry cleaned out of silk. Soy wax can be washed in hot water and Synthrapol. We will explore simple application techniques that give wonderful results. Beg/Intermediate.

All fabric classes meet 10 am - 4 pm and cost \$75. Fabric Dyeing I & II will be held at Desiree's studio near Suttons Bay. Map provided upon registration.
